FRANK LOESSER (1910-1969) Each of Loesser's Broadway musicals: Guys & Dolls, Where's Charley?, The Most Happy Fella, Greenwillow and How To Succeed In Business Without Really Trying, is a unique contribution to musical theater.

Before Broadway, Loesser supplied lyrics to the music of such greats as Jule Styne, Burton Lane, and Hoagy Carmichael, penning such hit film songs as "I Don't Want to Walk Without You," "Two Sleepy People," "Heart and Soul," and, as composer/lyricist, "Spring Will Be a Little Late this Year," "On a Slow Boat to China," and his 1948 Academy Award winner, "Baby, It's Cold Outside."
